The Sower
Bible Verse: Luke 8:4-15

Objectives:

- Learn about the parable of the sower
- Analyze each of the places mentioned by Jesus in this teaching

Your memory in Action:

"...which in an honest and good heart, having heard the word, keep it, and bring forth fruit..." Luke 8:15

This week we will be using the wheelbarrow method

3. Write the verse on a piece of cardstock or something big.
4. Write the verse on pieces of cardstock or construction paper word by word, two sets of these in different colors. Example

"... which in	an	heart	Honest and good	Keep it	And bring forth fruit	Heard the word

1. You will need two groups of 2 children so they can compete with each other.
2. Place the verses at one end of the place where you teach your class and the children in the other side, they should go looking the words of the verse one by one like a wheelbarrow until you can form the verse. The team that does it faster that will win.

Exploring the Bible:

Before starting today's teaching, ask your children; how did it go with the three colors heart? To whom they spoke about the love of Jesus this week? Listen carefully to each kid and with the same interest.

(Teacher, for today's teaching you will need: a visual aid that you will keep for all this month, the drawing of a sower)

¿ How many of you have ever planted a tree? or a flower? or a bean for a school project?; and what do we need to plant?

1. A seed (Teacher, you must get a seed, the one that makes it easier to get) this seed is very important because it depends on what we are going to harvest. If we have a mango seed what will we reap? or if it is an avocado seed? Nobody has planted oranges and harvested almonds. So the seed that we have is very important, and this seed today in our teaching will represent the word of God.
2. We also need dirt, a good soil represents that our seed can grow like a tree. The soil will represent the lives of the people to whom Jesus is shared, in our teaching.
3. Fertilizer, it is very important to give vitamins to our seed so that it grows strong and healthy; the fertilizer is the food of our seed. The fertilizer in our history will represent the Bible.

Today we'll be talking about something that Jesus spoke when he was here on earth, He taught a lot about the kingdom of heaven, teaching children, the young ones and adults about God's love for our lives and how to bring the word of God to others.

One day Jesus said: A man went out to sow, early in the morning he woke up before the sun came up, he took his bag, perhaps with a machete or a stick and left his house with a bag of seeds to sow. The Bible does not register what kind of seeds were, that's why I brought seeds of _____ (Mention the ones you took as a visual aid for your class)


When this man was walking, he was spreading the seed where he was passing by, and Jesus said that some of them fell by the road, but what do you think happens with the seeds that fall near the street? Some of these people stepped on them and others the birds ate them. And they never managed to grow as a strong tree.

These seeds represent the life of many people who hear the word of God, maybe come to the family group or they allow someone to speak to them about the love of Jesus, but their hearts are next to the road; when the problems come or their family or their "friends", they forget what they learned or heard. You are not one of those people Jesus spoke about in this teaching, even if your neighbors, friends or brothers come and want to take you to do what God doesn't like, you can say NO!; so that the seed God places in your life today can bear good fruit.

Class Activity

Kids from 3 to 6 years old

Instructions: Color the sower and fill the path with crepe paper
