



Sowing and harvest time

When we talk about sowing it means choosing a good land and preparing it with a lot of effort so that after it is ready we can plant the seed that has been previously chosen to obtain an abundant harvest. This month God has made a specific call for sowing and harvesting; which indicates there will be a great harvest, but it will depend on the care and preparation we have. We are talking about a great harvest of souls, but we must strive for this great work. Let us then prepare our spiritual life in prayer, clamor, fasting and crying for the souls that are to come.

We are living the final times in which God has promised his church the greatest harvest of souls ever seen. It will be a supernatural harvest; our eyes will see the mute speaking, the deaf hearing and the lame jumping.

God gave great wisdom to Joseph and he prepared the barns for the great harvest that was coming, he could see what God would do. **Genesis 41: 25-29**

Let's see three important things that Joseph did to see victory.

1. He kept his integrity. Genesis 39: 6-12 Before being a great harvester, we will be tested. This passage reveals that great victories awaited Joseph, but he had to face great challenges. If you are facing great challenges, don't worry, because they will help you see the great harvest. Maybe it was not like Joseph who was able to win, and maybe you failed; but you have a lawyer: Jesus Christ the Son of God. It is time to get up and affirm your feet and ankles, gird up now thy loins, God has not rejected you, and a great job awaits you; the hour of God has come for you. Strive to maintain your integrity. Be accountable to God; because to win souls, it is very important to maintain integrity. Joseph won because he never turned away from God.

2. He carried out the task entrusted to him. Genesis 41: 47-48 As God arranged, Joseph executed God's plans. Joseph did not refuse God's call for preservation; he did not keep resentments in his heart due to the mistreatment and injustices that had been committed with him. Joseph carefully analyzed God's plans, and not his own plans; this was what kept him in front. The Lord's call is clear; we are about to see the greatest harvest of souls; we must work hard on what He has said. Be obedient to your authority, be faithful that God wants to execute your plan in your life; and just as he did with Joseph, he will do it with you. The time for lamenting, for crying, for complaining, for raising your head, is the time of harvest.

3. He had mercy. Genesis 45: 4-5 Joseph in his position could have prosecuted his brothers and retaliate the evil that had previously done, but that was not the attitude of Joseph, but he had mercy on his brothers. Remember that God chose you from among your family for preservation. No matter how many times they fail, keep believing that they, like you, will also have an encounter with Jesus. It is time to intercede and seek our family. Joseph knew that the plan would not be complete, until his family was reunited with him; so there is a plan that will not be complete until your family is reunited with you in the house of the Lord. Remember that God has chosen you for preservation.

Get up today that there is a plan of God waiting for you. It is not only your conversion; it is not only your encounter with Christ, but all those who are to come because of your testimony. Jesus changes your life today; He takes you from slavery to a life full of victory. Put your eyes on Jesus, the author and finisher of the faith, and he will transform your life.



Sow with tears and reap in joy

Reading Psalm 126: 5-6 *they that sow in tears shall reap in joy.⁶ He that goeth forth and weepeth, bearing precious seed, shall doubtless come again with rejoicing, bringing his sheaves with him.*

Learn Psalm 126: 5

The farmer prepares the land where he will sow the seed; and sows with the certainty that he will harvest. "The farmer, in order to participate in the fruits, must work first". There will never be a harvest if you do not work first. If there is no sowing, there is no harvest. The farmer knows that he must have patience because in time, all that is sown will bear fruit.

Sow in tears. **Psalm 126: 5** *They that sow in tears shall reap in joy.*

Those who sow with tears know that they must pay a price to have a good harvest; but they yearn for their sowing to be fruitful, and they are willing to shed their tears, in order to see their harvest.

Those who sow with tears pray and humble themselves and go on their knees before God, presenting the land, presenting the field where they want to sow; they groan and cry so that when they sow the seed the field will produce some an hundredfold, some sixty, some thirty.

Those who sow with tears, fast to release the burdens of oppression, to loosen the bonds; they fast so that the land is good, so when the seed falls, it starts to bear fruit.

Those who sow with tears, keep their testimony, and do the things that please God, to be an example and thus have a great harvest. Those who sow with tears will always sow love, joy, peace, patience, faith, meekness, sow mercy and sow a good character.

Those who sow with tears are those who because of their sowing are persecuted, rejected, despised, and even mistreated, but in spite of everything, they continue to sow.

Reap in joy. **Psalm 126: 5** *they that sow in tears shall reap in joy.*

It is wonderful to be able to sow in the hope of harvesting and seeing the fruit of our work, of our effort, of our knees, of our sleeplessness, of our fasts, of our tears. After having sown with tears, the greatest joy is to be able to look at the harvest. See all those souls who come at the feet of Jesus, to see the change and the transformation of those lives, to see the glory of God filling their hearts; that brings joy to the one who sowed with tears. The greatest joy and satisfaction for a sower is to see how the Lord begins to work in the fruit, how it makes it grow and mature. That is why the psalmist says that those who sow in tears shall reap in joy.

Bearing seed for sowing. **Psalm 126:6** *He who continually goes forth weeping, Bearing seed for sowing, Shall doubtless come again with rejoicing, Bringing his sheaves with him.*

The precious seed is the word of God, that when it is spoken, preached, read, heard, scrutinized, it will never return empty. The duty of every child of God is to plant the seed wherever he goes, without sparing effort, sacrifice, or time.

He who carries the word of God, although through many difficulties, persecutions, and faces many that are opposed to preaching, must continue to sow the precious seed. "*He who continually goes forth weeping, Bearing seed for sowing.*" Many times the one who carries the precious seed suffers when he sees the rejection to the word; the one who bears the precious seed cries, becomes sad and becomes filled with pain when he sees the hardened heart of the souls; the one who carries the precious seed continues to sow, and keeps walking and crying, but still waiting for the harvest. The word of God will not return empty, it will germinate, produce and bear fruit.

When the sower looks at those souls to whom he had sown the precious seed of the word of God, those souls who had been hardened, who had rejected the word, and who now turn to the Lord, he will come again in joy, bringing his sheaves. "*He who continually goes forth weeping, Bearing seed for sowing, Shall doubtless come again with rejoicing, Bringing his sheaves with him.*"

Get happy, rejoice and sing, because the precious seed you have been sowing with tears, with sacrifice, with effort, will begin to bear fruit; the time to harvest has arrived.
