The Sower  
Bible Verse: Luke 8:4-15

Objectives:

- Understand each of the places where the seed fell and what they represent
- Learn that I can also sow the word of God in the lives of the people around me

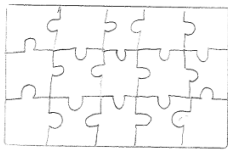
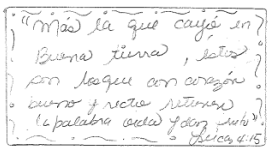
Your memory in Action:

"But that on the good ground are they, which in an honest and good heart, having heard the word, keep it, and bring forth ..." Luke 8:15

This week we will be using the puzzle method:

- You will need cardboard or paperboard
- Write the verse to be memorized on one side, decorate it as you like. Remember to call the child's attention
- In the other side draw the shapes of a puzzle and cut them.
- Try to make your puzzle pieces big.
- After reviewing the verse give the pieces to your children to be armed, if you have a big group, you can take two or three games and divide the room so that everyone participates

Exploring the Bible:

During the past Saturdays we have been talking about planting, what foods can we mention that need seeds in order to grow? (Listen to the children's response)

Now let's go back a little bit, for the apple or mango to be born, first they were a seed. Also for the corn and rice to grow, they need to have a seed and a good soil. But corn and rice do not grow like mango or a papaya that grow on trees, grows on spikes and could be born around grass, at the time of bearing fruit is when it differs from one another. And we will be talking about this today.

The past weeks we have reviewed what we need to plant and what it represents in the teaching that Jesus spoke.

1. The seed
2. The soil
3. Water

When the seeds fell on the road, what happened? And when they fell on the stones, what happened to them? (Wait for the children's response)

The Bible says that the sower continued in his sowing, remember that he was walking since very early in the morning and some of his seeds fell into a land where they could grow, they grew, they had water, but around that seed there were thorns that did not let her grow, they did not let her breathe, with her vines they did not let her take the sunlight (Remember that the sun is very important for a plant) and at the end this seed died.

Remember that the seed represents the word of God, what we learn every week in family meetings or in the church and what we find in the Bible. The soil is our life, where this seed is sown.

The seeds that fell in hawthorn represent the people who do hear the word of God, go to the cells or churches, but they do not have a good root they are weak because they do not receive the sunlight and are drowned by the riches or the pleasures of this world; says the Bible, and does not bear fruit and when drowned and without light, the seed dies.

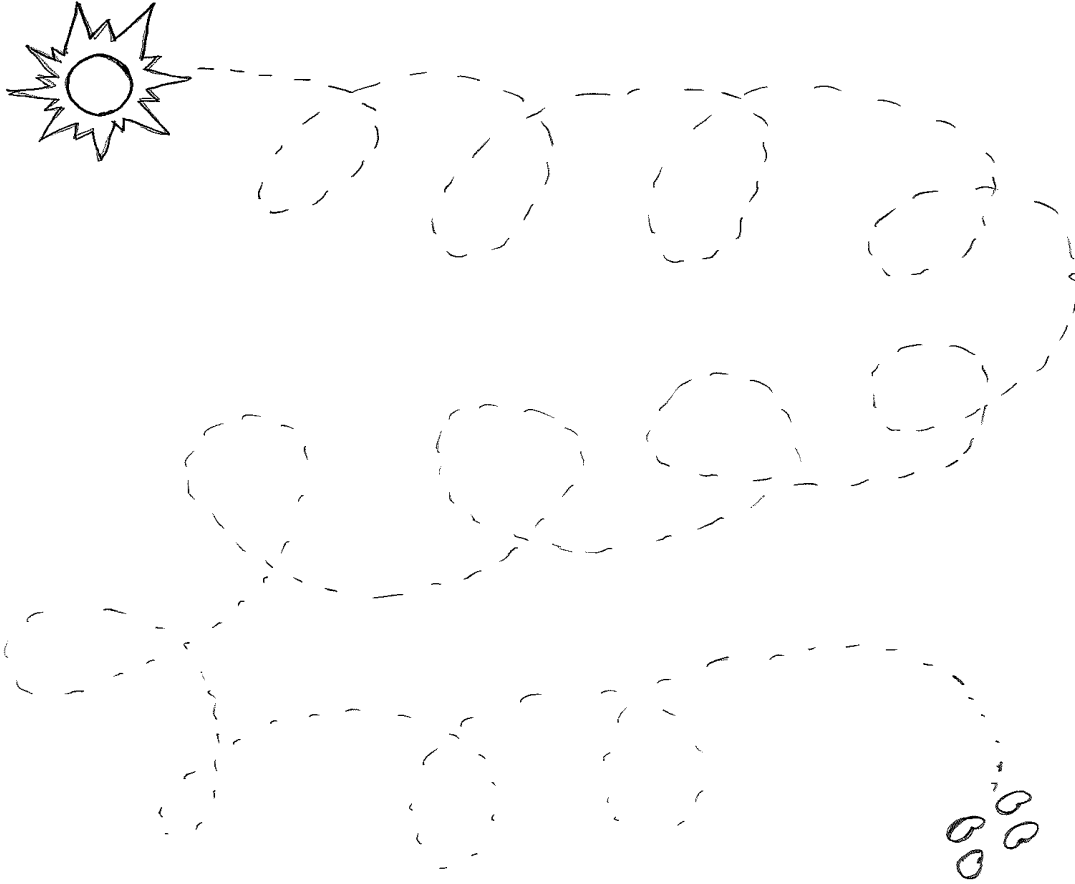
But, what does sunlight represent? The presence of God, the friendship we have with God. When a plant receives light, grows healthy and strong, when we have the light of Christ it does not matter if you have to study or do tasks or always work, in our lives God will be first. We will pray, we will read the Bible and we will have a friendship with God, but when we are worried more about a job or to watch television or to play or anything else we will become that weak seed, without strength.

Every day we need sunlight in our lives, to bear good fruits. Above all remember to share the word of God, because there are also people who need Jesus. And you can become the sower that God can use to make the seed fall on good soil.

Class Activity

Kids from 3 to 6 years old

Directions: With a crayon join the dots, helping the sun reach out the seed so it can grow strong and healthy. Remember to join the dots several times with different colors.
