The Best Promise  
Bible Verse: Acts 2:1-4

Objectives:

- Learn about the coming of the Holy Spirit to Earth
- Understand that will be with us every day

Your memory in action: "But anyone who doesn't love me, won't obey me. What they have heard me say doesn't really come from me, but from the Father who sent me." John 14:24

- Write your verse to memorize on a piece of cardboard or paperboard so that all children can read it.
- Divide your class in two
- You must carry balloons already blown (they could be a group of blue and others of green, the amount of balloons will depend on how you divide the verse to memorize, with the verse written on pieces of paper inside the balloon)
- The children of each team must run from one distance to another to break the balloon and assemble the verse
- The group that does it faster will win

Exploring the Bible: Have you heard the word Promise? And what do you think it is? (Listen to the children's response) promise: an offer that a person makes to fulfill with righteousness and fidelity a certain duty.

When Jesus was on earth he taught many things to his friends the disciples. He knew that he would not be physically with them forever, because he told them that it was necessary for him to leave and he made a promise to them, he would send a special gift to help them. This is why he asked them not to leave Jerusalem until this promise was fulfilled.

(Read the following qualities and tell the children to stand up when they think they know who you are talking about, ask them to whisper it in their ear and if their answer is the Holy Spirit, to remain standing)

- I teach the truth
- I am a guide
- I give consolation
- I testify of Jesus Christ
- Usually, I speak to your mind and your heart
- I am a member of the trinity
- I am a person of spirit therefore, I do not have a physical body

(You must carry a sign with the name of the Holy Spirit) Exactly, we will be talking about the Holy Spirit, this is the promise that Jesus gave to his disciples. John 14: 24-26

Jesus fulfilled this promise, when He was resurrected and ascended into heaven. The Bible says that the day of Pentecost (Pentecost is a holiday celebrated by the Jews) were the disciples and all the people who believed in Jesus in a high place, praying; and suddenly there came a roar from a strong wind that filled the whole house.

Have you heard the sound of a wind when it moves the trees? (Wait for the response of your children) So loud you could hear the rumble and the curtains rose from how strong it was (you could use wind sounds and bring a fan to simulate the wind inside the house) but they were not scared followed praying and they appeared tongues spread, as of fire on the head of each one and they were all filled with the Holy Spirit. Their lives since that day were different.


They no longer felt lonely or sad because Jesus was no longer there; they got up and began to preach about the kingdom of heaven.

All the qualities that were mentioned before have the Holy Spirit and there are still more, but he does not come into our lives if we do not ask him, he will be our constant companion, and he will guide and protect us. But we must ask for it through prayer, just as the disciples were gathered and filled with the Holy Spirit

Class Activity

Kids from 3 to 6 years old


Directions: Draw the pieces of fire in red, orange and yellow construction paper. You will stick the pieces and it will look like fire. Your teacher will help you staple or stick on a construction paper tape so that you can put it over your head as in the Pentecost!




Class Activity

For Kids from 7 to 11 years old

Directions: 1. In a cardboard cylinder you will stick the pigeon silhouette (for the cylinder use two construction paper together) You will decorate the cylinder according to the materials that your teacher gives you. 2. You will also need red, yellow and orange crepe paper as a symbol that the Holy Spirit is descending. 3. With the second mold and construction paper you will make several fires. Finally in the top of cylinder your teacher will give you wool so you can hang it in your room.
