



## Because for you is the promise Of the Holy Spirit

**Acts 2:16-18** <sup>16</sup>But this is what was spoken by the prophet Joel: <sup>17</sup> 'And it shall come to pass in the last days, says God, That I will pour out of My Spirit on all flesh; Your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, Your young men shall see visions, Your old men shall dream dreams. <sup>18</sup> And on My menservants and on My maidservants I will pour out My Spirit in those days; And they shall prophesy.

The prophet Joel spoke about the outpouring of the Holy Spirit. God had revealed to the prophet about this great event on everyone who invokes the Name of the Lord. The prophet Joel spoke that this move would bring an activation of the gifts and operations of the Holy Spirit among the people of God. This prophecy is a continuing promise for all who accept Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior, because all believers can and should be filled with the Holy Spirit.

**I will pour out of My Spirit on all flesh. Acts 2:17** *"And it shall come to pass in the last days, says God, That I will pour out of My Spirit on all flesh; Your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, Your young men shall see visions, Your old men shall dream dreams."*

The last days, refers to the days of Christ in the earth onwards. Today we are living in those last days.

The promise of the outpouring begins on the day of Pentecost, but is not limited to that day only, but thereafter the Holy Spirit continues to fill all believers in Christ Jesus.

Your sons and your daughters shall prophesy. This statement means both men and women; Their tongues are used to glorify God and to prophesy the wonders of him. This is a statement of the activation of the gifts of the Spirit, which comes from the outpouring of the Holy Spirit.

Your young men shall see visions; Your old men shall dream dreams. God will give dreams, and visions; These revelations will be given to those who constantly seek his presence, those who are filled with the Holy Spirit, who live according to the word of God, who fear God all the days of his life.

And on My menservants and on My maidservants. **Acts 2: 18** *"And on My menservants and on My maidservants I will pour out My Spirit in those days; And they shall prophesy."*

All those who belong to the kingdom of God, all those who have given their lives to Jesus Christ, all those who enjoy the salvation of their soul, who have had that encounter with Jesus, have this promise of the outpouring of the Holy Spirit; and they will prophesy.

God promises to pour out of his Spirit on all flesh, on the elders, on the young, on his servants and on his handmaidens, and declares that they will prophesy. This is great and extraordinary. If you were already baptized in the Holy Spirit, then you must continue to fill him every day; You have to be filled with the Holy Spirit every day.

**The outpouring of the Holy Spirit is for all who believe. Acts 2:39** *"For the promise is to you and to your children, and to all who are afar off, as many as the Lord our God will call."*

The promise is not for some; the outpouring of the Holy Spirit is for all those who have believed in the Lord Jesus and have received him as their Savior. If you have not yet received this promise from the Holy Spirit, it is important that you seek it in prayer, and ask it of God. Do not stop looking for it until you receive it. The Holy Spirit longs for you; the Lord wants to fill you. Today is the day for you to look for that promise par excellence, today is the day for you to be filled with the Holy Spirit, today is the day for you to be invested with power from on high. Today is the day for you to receive the Holy Spirit.



## **And suddenly came from heaven A rushing mighty wind**

**Lecture Acts 2:1-4** *<sup>1</sup>When the Day of Pentecost had fully come, they were all with one accord in one place. <sup>2</sup>And suddenly there came a sound from heaven, as of a rushing mighty wind, and it filled the whole house where they were sitting. <sup>3</sup>Then there appeared to them [b]divided tongues, as of fire, and one sat upon each of them. <sup>4</sup>And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak with other tongues, as the Spirit gave them utterance.*

### **Learn Acts 2:4**

The day of Pentecost was the celebration of the solemn feast of the harvest, where the people rejoiced before God and brought an offering to God as he had been blessed. The Jews faithfully celebrated this feast of fifty days; and just when the day of Pentecost came, they were all together together; suddenly the outpouring of the Holy Spirit came.

The disciples obey the command of Jesus. Acts 1:12-13 After seeing Jesus go to heaven, those on the mountain returned to Jerusalem in obedience to Jesus' command; and when they arrive they go up to the upper room where the disciples lived. They are going to wait for the promise of the Father, and they remain together.

All continued with one accord in prayer and supplication Acts 1:14,15 persevered unanimously, they longed for the promise, and they knew that they should be united, have the same feeling and agree, to be able to pray and pray to God for the promise. There was perseverance, in seeking the promise of the Father; they were willing to remain in prayer as long as it was necessary, but they wanted to receive the Holy Spirit. They did not surrender, nor faint, because they believed the Lord and obeyed Him. They believed that he was going to send the promise of the baptism in the Holy Spirit; they believed that the other Comforter would come: they believed what Jesus told them: that they would be baptized with the Holy Spirit, not many days from now. That is why they persevered unanimously in prayer and prayer.

Like those who were gathered in the upper room waiting to be baptized with the Holy Spirit, every believer in Jesus Christ must persevere unanimously in prayer and prayer, until they are filled with the Holy Spirit.

When the Day of Pentecost had fully come. Acts 2:1 *When the Day of Pentecost had fully come, they were all with one accord in one place.*

There was unity, they were together; there were no strife, there were no divisions, there were no disagreements. When the day of Pentecost arrived, they were unanimous together. God sends his blessing and salvation where there is unity.

And suddenly came from heaven. Acts 2:2 *And suddenly there came a sound from heaven, as of a rushing mighty wind, and it filled the whole house where they were sitting.* Those who were gathered in the upper room were waiting for the promise of the outpouring of the Holy Spirit. They had received a command from Jesus not to leave Jerusalem until they were invested with power from on high. Those who were gathered persevered in prayer, and in the search for the promise of the Father. And suddenly there came a sound from heaven, that was like a rush of impetuous wind, a loud noise, that blew. Suddenly God sent his promise; suddenly the Holy Spirit came from heaven; suddenly the long-awaited promise came over those one hundred and twenty. From heaven, as of a rushing mighty wind, It blew and filled the whole house. When the Holy Spirit blows, it is to fill.

Divided tongues, as of fire. Acts 2:3 *Then there appeared to them divided tongues, as of fire, and one sat upon each of them.*

The arrival of the Holy Spirit was extraordinary, wonderful, supernatural. On each of those who were in the upper room, tongues appeared to them as of fire. The Holy Spirit has arrived! The other Comforter came! When the day of Pentecost came they were all united together, and suddenly the outpouring of the Holy Spirit came from heaven.

And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit. Acts 2:4 *And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak with other tongues, as the Spirit gave them utterance.*

The one hundred and twenty gathered, those who were persevering unanimously in prayer and petition; those who in obedience to the Lord did not leave Jerusalem, but stayed and awaited the promise, they were all filled with the Holy Spirit; all were baptized with the Holy Spirit, as the Lord had said.

And began to speak with other tongues, as the Spirit gave them utterance. One of the notable manifestations of the baptism in the Holy Spirit is speaking in other languages. All those who were baptized with the Holy Spirit, began to speak in other languages.

The Lord wants to fill all believers with the Holy Spirit; only that each one has to ask for it, and look for it. All who repent of all their sins, and turn to Jesus, will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. **Acts 2:38** *Then Peter said to them, "Repent, and let every one of you be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins; and you shall receive the gift of the Holy Spirit.*
