



The sacrifice of Jesus on the cross It is the demonstration of God's love

Romans 5: 6-11

The demonstration of God's love for us is to have given his only begotten Son, to offer his life on the cross so that we may have eternal life. The greatest, most extraordinary and marvelous demonstration is that while still sinners, Christ died for us.

Christ died for the unholy. Romans 5: 6-7 ⁶ *For when we were still without strength, [d]in due time Christ died for the ungodly. ⁷ For scarcely for a righteous man will one die; yet perhaps for a good man someone would even dare to die.*

If there is something great in this life, it is that Christ died for the ungodly. When we were still weak, he died for all. Who dares to give his life for another? The word says that hardly any will die for a just one; and perhaps someone dares to die for the good.

Christ died for us. Romans 5: 8 *But God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us.*

He shows his love. God made the greatest love show that ever existed. He showed his love by giving his only begotten Son, giving him to give his life on the cross. "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son." He showed his love in the person of Jesus Christ, so that man may receive that love; so that through the love he showed there would be a true repentance of sin, and people would come to the feet of Christ.

Being still sinners. He shows his love for us, in that while we are still sinners, while we are evil, while we are dead in trespasses and sins, Christ died for us. Being still sinners, He died to give us eternal life; being still sinners, he died to give us salvation; being still sinners, Christ died for us.

Justified in his blood. Romans 5: 9 *Much more then, having now been justified by His blood, we shall be saved from wrath through Him.*

We are already justified in the blood of Jesus; in the instant that we repent of our sins, and accept Jesus Christ as our Savior, we were washed and cleansed of our sins in that blood that He shed on the cross; Being justified in his blood, we will be saved from wrath through him; by him we will be saved from the judgments and the things that will come.

We were reconciled by the death of Christ, and saved by his life. Romans 5: 10-11 *For if when we were enemies we were reconciled to God through the death of His Son, much more, having been reconciled, we shall be saved by His life. ¹¹ And not only that, but we also rejoice in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have now received the reconciliation.*

Without Christ we were enemies of God, we were separated from him, since we were in crimes and sins, but with the death of Jesus Christ we were reconciled with God. "Thank you Lord for your death on the cross." We are no longer enemies of God, since Christ reconciled us to him; and being reconciled, we will be saved by the life of Jesus Christ. "Thank you Lord for your life." We were reconciled with his death, much more, being reconciled, we will be saved for his life.

When we were not worthy, being still sinners, he sent his Son to die in our place. **Romans 5: 8** *But God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us.*

God shows his love for us with the sacrifice of his only begotten Son; God shows his love for us, sending his Son to give his life for us, so that we may have salvation and eternal life; Let us be grateful to him for that great love, for the salvation he gave us through Jesus Christ, and let us tell other people that they have hope, that there is someone who loves them and wants to give them eternal life.



The good shepherd gives his life for the sheep

Lecture John 10: 7-11 ⁷ Then Jesus said to them again, "Most assuredly, I say to you, I am the door of the sheep. ⁸ All who ever came [a]before Me are thieves and robbers, but the sheep did not hear them. ⁹ I am the door. If anyone enters by Me, he will be saved, and will go in and out and find pasture. ¹⁰ The thief does not come except to steal, and to kill, and to destroy. I have come that they may have life, and that they may have it more abundantly. ¹¹ "I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd gives His life for the sheep.

Learn John 10: 11

The children of God are grateful for the sacrifice that Jesus made on the cross; the death of Christ is not the death of defeat, but a death of victory. It was the most glorious death there was, because by that death today we can have life, and we can have it in abundance, and we can have eternal life.

The sacrifice of Jesus is for us to have life. Juan 10: 10 *The thief does not come except to steal, and to kill, and to destroy. I have come that they may have life, and that they may have it more abundantly.*

The devil wants to destroy the present and the future of the people; the enemy wants to kill the dreams, the vision and all the good that there is; the thief wants to steal peace, joy, patience, health, and steal the opportunity for people to be saved; the only one who wants to see you badly, who wants to kill the good in man, is the devil; but the Lamb of glory came to undo the works of the devil; the sacrifice of Jesus was for us to have life; he does not want you to suffer, he already suffered for you on the cross; He wants to give you eternal life, and have a different life here on earth. Just look for it and everything will change in you. It is the purpose of God, that we live in blessing on earth; and that we have health and salvation.

He gave his life for the sheep. John 10: 11 *I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd gives His life for the sheep.* He himself is called: "the good Shepherd"; because there are bad shepherds, or who are not interested in the flock; but the good shepherd, the one who loves the sheep, gives himself for them, suffers for them, heals their wounds; he puts them in his arms, and if any is lost, he searches until he finds her. Jesus is that Good Shepherd. He gave himself up for his sheep; he suffered the punishment on the cross for each of us, who deserve nothing. He is the one who gave himself, who gave his life for me, and for you. No one else would give his life the way Jesus did. Us being still sinners, Christ died for all of us.

Nobody took his life. John 10:17-18 ¹⁷ "Therefore My Father loves Me, because I lay down My life that I may take it again. ¹⁸ No one takes it from Me, but I lay it down of Myself. I have power to lay it down, and I have power to take it again. This command I have received from My Father."

Jesus declares the Father's love towards him; he counted on the love of the Father, for giving his life for his sheep; Jesus wanted to give his life on the cross; He wanted to die so that you and I can have life. He wanted to suffer in our place; He gave his life voluntarily; No one took his life, he gave his life for love of you and for love of me.

The sacrifice of Jesus brings us to the Father. John 14: 6 *Jesus used this illustration, but they did not understand the things which He spoke to them.*

Some do not know where to go, they are disoriented and do not know where to walk; they need to know what the road is; If someone wants to know what is the way to go on this earth, then let him know that Jesus is the only way to go; if someone wants to know the truth or they feel confused because they have heard so many things and do not know what the truth is, then they need to know Jesus, he is the truth; and if someone longs to have life, or needs a change in his life, he needs a different life, Jesus Christ is life.

And nobody comes to the Father, if it is not for Jesus. To go to the Father, it is necessary to go through Jesus. There is no other way, there is no other way; to have communion with God, it is necessary to know Jesus Christ, who died to open the path that leads us to the Father.

Jesus gave his life on the cross, he carried our sins, and he suffered our pains. He wanted to do it, because he loved us; He wanted to give us life. Jesus said: "*I have come that they may have life, and that they may have it more abundantly.*"
